Parents of obese children may not be able to recognise that their kid is overweight unless they are at very extreme levels of obesity, new research shows. The study published in the British Journal of General Practice found that parents are additionally more likely to underestimate their child's weight if they are Black or south Asian, from more deprived backgrounds or if their offspring is male.

This method is similar to how computer worms spread through both the Internet and local networks to infect as many computers as possible. The new HIV progression model for this "hybrid spreading" accurately predicts patients' progression from HIV to AIDS in a major clinical trial.

E-Cigarette flavoring chemicals may pose risks when inhaled

New findings about the flavorings used in e-cigarettes continue to raise questions about the safety of currently used products and what kinds of regulation might be appropriate to apply to the industry. An investigation of two disposable-cartridge brands – BLU and NJOY – and half a dozen different brands of e-cigarette flavors found high levels of flavoring chemicals in the liquids, according to [the study published](#) yesterday in the journal Tobacco Control.

The move of a Belgian patient who began to search for a donor among his Facebook friends sparked a discussion among doctors and patients in Europe about the current system, which is based on strict laws and anonymity. The study, published April 16 in the *American Journal of Public Health*, found that smokers who used e-cigarettes were less likely to quit regular cigarettes than those who hadn't tried the devices.
