Report from The International Training Course on Research in Public Mental Health

In July 2015, already for the second time, the EUPHA Section on Public mental health, in collaboration with the Institute of Public Health, Faculty of Medicine, Vilnius University (Lithuania) and the University of Applied Sciences Emden/Leer (Germany) organized an international training course on *Research in public mental health* in Vilnius, Lithuania. The course aimed at strengthening research capacity, networking and collaboration in Public Mental Health. The main target group was doctoral students, public health researchers and practitioners.

Prof. Dr. Jutta Lindert (University of Applied Sciences Emden/Leer), President of the Section, delivered a course on research methods in public mental health and public mental health epidemiology. This year's course focussed on life events and mental health over the life course. Presentation of most recent research and theory was followed by the practical development of life events questionnaires in the specific context of Lithuania. At the end of the course a viewpoint on the national mental health profile was prepared. Course attendants were granted international training certificates issued by EUPHA, Vilnius University and the University of Applied Sciences Emden/Leer. The course was organized by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Marija Veniute (Vilnius University), Vice President of the Section on Public mental health.

The course was very positively evaluated by staff and students. The course contributed to capacity building in public mental health research. By co-organising this training course, EUPHA was able to respond to a major demand within the public health community in the Eastern European region. The Section intends to continue these international training and education activities in the next years.

The European health report 2015

The European health report is a flagship publication, published every three years. The 2012 report set the baseline for monitoring progress towards the six targets of the European policy framework, Health 2020. The 2015 report presents the progress made since the baseline. An assessment of the available data on all the targets reveals that the European Region is on track, but much potential remains for further health gains and reductions in inequalities.

The 2015 report gives an update on the challenges in measuring and reporting on progress towards Health 2020, particularly in measuring well-being, and proposes new sources of qualitative evidence to describe and monitor well-being.

Facts and figures are not enough to report meaningfully on what it means to be healthy and well in Europe. The 2015 European health report argues that new forms of evidence are necessary to fully capture this. Stronger international collaboration is required to advance the agenda for health-information research and development in the Region.
