 Next multiannual financial framework and recovery package: the European Parliament and the Council presidency reach a political agreement

10 November 2020

On 10 November 2020, the Council of the European Union and the European Parliament's negotiators reached a political agreement in talks on the next Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF), the EU's long-term budget after ten weeks of intense negotiation. The agreement complements the comprehensive financial package of €1 824.3 billion negotiated by EU leaders in July, which combines the next MFF − €1 074.3 billion − and a €750 billion temporary recovery instrument, Next Generation EU (in 2018 prices).

The Parliament had been advocating for the introduction of new resources and an overall increased amount of the EU budget and obtained EUR 16 billion on top of the package agreed by heads of state or government at their July summit. The political package agreed by both institutions includes:

- Overall, more than 50% of the total amount will support modernisation through policies that
 include research and innovation, via Horizon Europe; fair climate and digital transitions, via
 the Just Transition Fund and the Digital Europe Programme; preparedness, recovery and
 resilience, via the Recovery and Resilience Facility, rescEU and a new health programme,
 EU4Health.
- €15 billion have been added through additional means (€12.5 billion) and reallocations (€2.5 billion) in the course of the next financial period, for the reinforcement of EU programmes, including Horizon Europe (€4bn), EU4Health (€3,4bn) and Erasmus+ (€2,2bn), Border and Security (€1,5bn) and Humanitarian aid (€0,5bn).
- more flexibility to allow the EU to respond to unforeseen needs (€1 billion)
- greater involvement of the budgetary authority in the oversight of revenue under Next Generation EU
- higher ambition on biodiversity and strengthened monitoring of biodiversity, climate and gender related spending
- an indicative roadmap towards the introduction of new own resources

On 16 November, the Members of Parliament's negotiating team MFF and Own Resources will debrief the committee on the political agreement. The provisional agreement still needs to be endorsed by the Council, Parliament's President and political group leaders and will be subject to votes in the BUDG committee (23 November - tbc) and the plenary (November II - tbc). If agreed, it needs to be published in the Official Journal before the end of the year for all legal acts to enter into force on 1 January 2021.
